- **WHO:** Qualified professionals who are new to seating practice or have experience and would like to refresh their knowledge on the fundamentals of seating as well as components of running an outreach clinic: including occupational therapy, orthotists and prosthetists; speech and language therapy and physiotherapy.
- **WHY:** Seating is a specialized skill requiring postgraduate training. Current curriculums at universities do not prepare students fully for the realities of wheelchair service provision and so most knowledge and skills come at a postgraduate level. Many institutions require seating skills or offer seating services and so having the basic knowledge in order to practice these skills is very useful.
- **WHAT:** Participation in this program will enable participants to respond appropriately to much-needed interventions in the seating service domain (whether private or public) and to provide channels for development and remote support in seating. Participants will have opportunities to apply theory in different contexts and will be equipped with skills to ensure appropriate clinical reasoning and problem-solving. They will be familiarized with the assessment, prescriptions and fitting principles, 24 hour positioning, the ordering process, the components of wheelchairs, Shonaquip devices as well as resources needed for outreach and what to do when resources are scarce.
